### **NOTICE OF RACE**

**VENUE:** Racing to be held at sea off Tynemouth / South Shields. Access to the water from Priors Haven, Tynemouth, located on the north bank of the Tyne Estuary adjacent to Tynemouth Castle & Priory. Changing and refreshment facilities available in the Clubhouse. Bar & Galley in TSC Clubhouse

**TRAVEL:** Train from London King's X to Newcastle (<3hrs) then Metro to Tynemouth Station (5min walk from TSC)  
Fly to Newcastle Airport & Metro - Airport to Tynemouth

**REGISTRATION & BRIEFING:** Registration in TSC Clubhouse from 12 noon on Saturday 31<sup>st</sup> July & from 10.00 on Sunday 1<sup>st</sup> Aug  
Briefing in the clubhouse at 18.30 on Sunday 1<sup>st</sup> August

**RACING AREA AND COURSES:** The racing area shall be either in the North Bay off Tynemouth to the north of the North Pier; or in the South Bay off South Shields to the south of the South Pier. Courses shall either be 'windward-leeward' or 'triangle-sausage'.

**ELIGIBILITY:** The regatta is open to all boats of the international 14 class with a current measurement certificate. All boats must be adequately insured with cover of at least £5million against third party claims.

**MEASUREMENT AND INSPECTION:** A valid measurement certificate must be presented at registration. Measurement spot checks may be made at any time during the event.

**ENTRY FEE:** £300 per boat to include 2 tickets for POW Dinner on Friday 6<sup>th</sup> August at The Grand Hotel, Tynemouth and post sailing pasta after racing each day. **Reduced Entry Fee:** £280.00 per boat for entries received before July 1<sup>st</sup> 2021  
Online entry found at <http://tynemouthsc.co.uk/> Sailing Instructions will be provided on receipt of entry.

**INSURANCE:** Each participating boat shall be insured with a valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of £2,000,000 per incident or equivalent.

**RACING RULES:** All races to be governed by the Racing Rules of Sailing 2021-2024 and the Sailing Instructions (SI's)

**ADVERTISING:** In accordance with RRS 6.1 boats may be required to display advertising chosen and supplied by the organising authority

**SCORING:** For the UK Championships, 8 races are scheduled & 3 races must be completed to constitute a series. When fewer than 5 races have been completed, each boat's series score will be the total of her scores. When 5 or more races are completed a boats series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score

**RISK STATEMENT:** Rule 3 of the Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS 3) states, 'The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue racing is hers alone'. Sailing is by its nature an unpredictable sport and therefore inherently involves an element of risk. By taking part in the event each competitor agrees and acknowledges that:

- (a) They are aware of the inherent element of risk involved in the sport and accept responsibility for the exposure of themselves their crew and their boat to such inherent risk whilst taking part in the event;
- (b) They are responsible for the safety of themselves, their crew, their boat and other property whether afloat or ashore;
- (c) They accept responsibility for any injury, damage or loss to the extent caused by their own actions or omissions
- (d) Their boat is in good order, equipped to sail in the event and they are fit to participate;
- (e) The provision of a race management team, safety boats and other officials and volunteers by the event organiser does not relieve them of their own responsibilities;
- (f) The provision of safety boat cover is limited to such assistance, particularly in extreme weather conditions, as can practicably be provided in the circumstances
- (g) It is their responsibility to familiarise themselves with any risks specific to this venue or this event drawn to their attention in any rules and information produced for the venue or event and to attend any safety briefing held for the event;

The fact that race officials may conduct inspections of a boat does not reduce the responsibilities of each competitor set out in this Notice of Race
